

The Hebrew word shows up 3 times (out of 105 verses), being rendered diligence. The other 102 times it was rendered "it may well be; pleased; was good; may go well; may be merry; seemeth best; have found favor; thou hast well; surely; to do well; make smart; good; will do good; aright; better; mercy;"

This Hebrew word shows up over 800 times but is rendered twice in one verse.

But know that the LORD hath set apart him that is godly for himself: The LORD will hear when I call unto him.

Psalms 9:10

And they *that know* thy name will put their trust in thee: For thou, LORD, hast not forsaken them that seek thee.

They "do" not deal slowly nor, delay nor do partial things. They put their hand in such a way as to act now in a decided way to all the items at hand with few errors.

A Diligent Person

A diligent person does not get sidetracked in life, career, business, work, occupation, etc.

They are extremely focused. They do not start to go in a path of life and then change because of:

- The fear of man
- The fear of loss
- The fear of failure

They do not cut and run. Many times just after a non-diligent person shoots the deer they refuse to eat it. The diligent person places exceeding value on what they have.

Proverbs12:27

The slothful man roasteth not that which he took in hunting: but the substance of a *diligent* man is precious.

A Non-diligent person has desires that are not fulfilled.

It is a mental struggle. The mental issues of the diligent however are to place great value on results.

Proverbs 13:4

The soul of the sluggard desireth, and hath nothing: but the soul of the *diligent* shall be made fat.

The diligent think in stages, not as a whole.

They are careful to first define concepts. Then strategize, then the major parts, then they organize the parts, then they staff, then direct, then control all with financial control. The diligent think in these stages which require patience. However the non-diligent tend to be quick to decide without having learned the *art of thinking in stages*.

A diligent person will know the details of their business, job, or household.

Not surface detail, but knowing what you know (i.e.,) understanding
