



Psalms 119 Satan's Battle Against God's Ways

Satan needs a man to use. He selects a proud man – wicked – the evil man – and, if possible, a scorner.

A scorner is a man with two characteristics:

- Proud
- Haughty

Scorner is his name who deals in proud wrath. Then Satan works through this man to go against God's ways.

First - Satan is opposite of God's ways; *Second* - he finds a man to use to come against you; *Third* - his primary objective is to get you to give up your confidence so you turn away from God's ways.

Thus, it is his way of attempting to show God's ways do not work. He attempts **to shame you** to lose confidence.

The **Greek** word for confidence is Hupostasis. It derives from two Greek words, Hupo (under) and Stasis (to stand). To be under God's authority and leading and to stand as a result. This word is one-half of the ingredient of faith – to eliminate confidence is to then destroy faith.

Hupostasis

Hupostasis is 1/2 of faith

Hebrews 1:3 (Person)

Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his *person*, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on High;

Hebrews 3:14 (Confidence)

For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our *confidence* steadfast unto the end;

Hebrews 11:1 *(Substance)*

Now faith is the *substance* of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Shame then *should not* be accepted from a scorner if not deserved. (also rendered confusion, dishonor, ignominy in the Hebrew word kah-lohn)

Kah-lohn

Proverbs 9:7

He that reprove h a scorner getteth to himself *shame*: and he that rebuketh a wicked man getteth himself a blot.

Proverbs 22:10

Cast out the *scorner*, and contention shall go out; yea, strife and reproach shall cease.

Parreesia

Parreesia is rendered confidence and boldness. This is a characteristic of an individual after having trusted in the Lord.

Hebrews 10:35

Cast not away your *confidence*, which hath great recompence of reward.

Hebrews 3:6-13

But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the *confidence* and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end. **7**. Wherefore (as the Holy Ghost saith, today if ye will hear his voice, **8**. Harden not your hearts, as in the provocation, in the day of temptation in the wilderness: **9**. When your fathers tempted me, proved me, and saw my works forty years. **10**. Wherefore I was grieved with that generation, and said, they do always err in their heart: and they have not known my ways. **11**. So I swear in my wrath, they shall not enter into my rest.) **12**. Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God. **13**. But exhort one another daily. While it is called today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin."

Hebrews 3:14-19

For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our *confidence* steadfast unto the end; **15.** while it is said, today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts, as in the provocation. **16.** For some, when they had heard, did provoke: howbeit not all that came out of Egypt by Moses. **17.** But with whom was he grieved forty years? Was it not with them that had sinned, whose carcasses fell in the wilderness? **18.** And to whom swear he that they should not enter into his rest, but to them that believed not? **19.** So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief."

Hebrews 4:1-12

Let us therefore fear, lest, a promise being left us of entering into his rest, any of you should seem to come short of it. 2. For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them: but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it. 3. For we which have believed do enter into rest, as he said, as I have sworn in my wrath, if they shall enter into my rest: although the works were finished from the foundation of the world. 4. For he spake in a certain place of the seventh day on this wise, and God did rest the seventh day from all his works. 5. And in this place again, if they shall enter into my rest, 6. Seeing therefore it remaineth that some must enter therein, and they to whom it was first preached entered not in because of unbelief: 7. Again, he limiteth a certain day, saying in David, today, after so long a time; as it is said, today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts. 8. For if Jesus had give them rest, then would not he afterward have spoken of another day. 9. There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God. 10. For he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his. **11**. Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief. 12. For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and shaper than any two-edged sword, piercing even the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

Hebrews 4:16

Let us therefore come **boldly** unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.

Ephesians 3:12

In whom we have **boldness** and access with confidence by the faith of Him.

Philippians 1:20

According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all **boldness**, as always, so now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by death.

I Timothy 3:13

For they that have used the office of a deacon will purchase to themselves a good degree, and great *boldness* in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.

I John 2:28

And now, little children, abide in him; that when he shall appear, we may have *confidence*, and not be ashamed before him at his coming.

Beloved, if our heart condemn us not, (then) have we *confidence* toward God.

I John 4:17

Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have *boldness* in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.

I John 5:14

And this is the *confidence* that we have in him, that if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us.

The primary object of a scorner is to destroy faith by removing Hupostasis (confidence-substance)

Hebrews 11:1-6

Now faith is the *substance* of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (1/2 of faith). 2 For by it the elders obtained a good report. 3 Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which do appear. 4 By faith Abel offered unto God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, by which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts: 5 By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God. 6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must belief that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Hebrews 11:24-27

By faith Moses, when he came to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; **25** Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; **26** Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward. **27** By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible."

Hebrews 11:32-39

And what shall I more say? Wherefore lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees 13 And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed. 14 Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord: 15 Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled; 16 Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright. 17 For ye know how that afterward, when he would have inherited the blessing, he was rejected: for he found no place of repentance, though he sought it carefully with tears.

Hebrews 12:28-29

Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and Godly fear: **29** For our God as a consuming fire

Hebrews 13:13

Let us go forth therefore unto him without the camp, bearing his reproach.

To then eliminate confidence **(Hupostasis)** one must accept shame from a scorner or other person that is not deserved. Therefore, to destroy faith one must remove confidence. *A method used by a scorner is to impute shame.*

The **Greek** word, Kataischuno (kata – aischuno) is from two words – intensively down and to put down. (also rendered confound, dishonor, shame).

It means to have a feeling of shame or fear which prevents a person from doing a thing;

0r

A feeling of shame arising from something that has been done.

- 1. There is shame from doing wrong.
- 2. There is imputed shame from another to us to convince us we did wrong.
 - a) Sometimes rightfully
 - b) Sometimes wrongfully
- 3. It is also a Greek word to describe shame. Shame when standing before God at the judgment.

However, when **kata** is before the **Greek** word **aischuno**, it is generally imputed shame – to be put to shame – to dishonor – to disgrace.

Romans 5:1-5

Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ; **2** By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. **3** And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; **4** And patience, experience; and experience, hope: **5** And hope *maketh* not *ashamed*; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us." (maketh ashamed is the Greek word Kataischuno).

Kataischuno

Romans 9:33

Perverse Disputing's

From the Greek word paradiatribe or sometimes spelled diaparatrine

para – to be beside or to run alongside or truth dia – to pass through tribo – to wear out

Suggesting attrition or wearing out by contention. It uses hostility, enmity. It is intensive . . . the word wrangling in the Bible is the same word. The best definition is "obstinate contest". . . galling from one to another.

From Such Withdraw Thyself

The **Greek** word "aphistemi" is rendered withdrawn, to cause to depart, to stand off, be aloof, to depart.



SCORNER

A scorner is from combining proud and haughty:

Proverbs 21:24 *Proud* and *haughty* scorner is his name, who dealeth in proud wrath.

Two sides of same coin - scorner and wicked

Proverbs 9:7

He that reprove h a scorner getteth to himself shame: and he that rebuketh a wicked man getteth himself a blot.

Different people (generally) but they tend to associate together with the scorner generally getting the upper hand.

Again the two ingredients that make a scorner:

- Proud
- Haughty

It produces a scorner. Their actions are proud wrath.

Scorner

Greek - scorn – kata (down) gelao (a jest or laugh of incredulity – to deride)

To deride – to be shocked at another's actions because they see that any action apart from how they think is stupid. A laughter of mocking. To put down through professional mocking.

Haughty – Hoper (over) Phaenomai ("to appear") To be pre-eminent – rendered haughty – arrogant – disdainful – proud. To manifest – or show oneself above others – to appear pre-eminent.

Anger - (Orge) As different from wrath (Thumos)
An agitated feeling from inward indignation.
Greek thumos expresses more the inward feeling – orge the emotion – very reactionary.
To put both Greek words together is to get "the fierceness of reactionary attack".

A Scorner is Proud Knowing Nothing

I Timothy 6:4-5

He is proud, *knowing nothing*, but doting about questions and strifes of words, whereof cometh envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings, **5** Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself.

The word **NOTHING** is used: it is from the **Greek** word, "meden" generally rendered "no man", as well – it means "no one" . . . it is negative . . . in warnings, prohibitions, etc., in expressing impossibilities.

I Timothy 6:4

... intimating a supposition to the contrary.

The meaning in **I Timothy 6:4** is to be proud, not understanding people "at all. " It is to know nothing of people – *mostly because the word proud in the Old Testament used for a scorner is "to be as God" and haughty, "to be preeminent over men.*

Therefore, to be as God and over all men and be human is to know nothing about men. It produces the following:

The word Oppress in Psalms 119:121 has been rendered also as deceived, defrauded, or in the wrong. The Hebrew word is Gah-shak' Psalms 119:21 – Leave me not to mine oppressors

Two other Hebrew words show up as well ... geh-shek and gosh-kah

In the **Greek**, it shows up in the A.V. version as **MISCHIEF**, from the Greek word, "rhadiourgia", meaning also villiany . . . lit. denotes ease in working (rhadios . . . easy; work) or easiness, laziness, hence recklessness, wickedness. In the papyri, it is used of theft.

The **Greek** similar word, rhadiourgema, is lewdness or a reckless act of behavior.

Scorner - Hebrew

SCORN

Mockery, ridicule, or contempt. This concept appears in several passages in the Bible. Among the more significant is Ps 22:7, where Jesus Christ is prophesied as One who will become the object of scorn. This is because of the seeming contradiction between His claims and His death in suffering and disgrace. In the same way, those who continue to follow the Lord in the midst of adverse circumstances are scorned by others (Ps 44:13; 79:4). Nevertheless, the righteous will be vindicated as Christ was in His resurrection. Therefore, God's blessing rests on those who refuse to join with the scornful (Ps 1:1).

SCORNFUL

The act of expressing contempt toward others (Ps 1:1). The scornful are proud, arrogant people who scoff at the way of peace and make mockery of goodness. Also see SCOFFERS.

SCOFFER

One who shows contempt by mocking, sneering, or scorning (Gen 21:9; Ps 73:8). Unlike the good man, who walks the path of wisdom, the scoffer is a wicked man who follows the path of folly, refusing to listen to the wisdom of others.

SCORN (Heb. *sehoq*). Spoken of the wild donkey, having contempt for civilization (Job 39:7). In 39:18 the same word is used of the ostrich who "laughs at the horse and his rider." In Isa 29:20 the "scorner" ("mocker," NIV) is one who "will be finished" (Heb. *lus*, "to make mouths, deride," elsewhere "scoffer"). See Scoffer; Laugh; Derision; Disdain; Mock.

Scorner - Greek

LAUGH, LAUGH TO SCORN

1. gelao "to laugh," is found in Luke 6:21,25. This signifies loud laughter in contrast to demonstrative weeping.

2. **katagelao** denotes "to laugh scornfully at," more emphatic than No. 1 (**kata**, "down," used intensively, and No. 1), and signifies derisive laughter, Matt 9:24; Mark 5:40; Luke 8:53. Cf. ekmukterizo, "to deride."

Note: The laughter of incredulity, as in Gen 17:17 and 18:12, is not mentioned in the NT.
