

Greedy - Hebrew

SOUL; SELF; LIFE

A. Noun.

nepesh OT:5315, "soul; self; life; person; heart." This is a very common term in both ancient and modern Semitic languages. It occurs over 780 times in the Old Testament and is evenly distributed in all periods of the text with a particularly high frequency in poetic passages.

The basic meaning is apparently related to the rare verbal form, **napash**. The noun refers to the essence of life, the act of breathing, taking breath. However, from that concrete concept, a number of more abstract meanings were developed. In its primary sense the noun appears in its first occurrence in Gen 1:20: "the moving creature that hath life," and in its second occurrence in Gen 2:7: "living soul."

However, in over 400 later occurrences it is translated "soul." While this serves to make sense in most passages, it is an unfortunate mistranslation of the term. The real difficulty of the term is seen in the inability of almost all English translations to find a consistent equivalent or even a small group of high-frequency equivalents for the term. The KIV alone uses over 28 different English terms for this one Hebrew word. The problem with the English term "soul" is that no actual equivalent of the term or the idea behind it is represented in the Hebrew language. The Hebrew system of thought does not include the combination or opposition of the terms "body" and "soul," which are really Greek and Latin in origin. The Hebrew contrasts two other concepts which are not found in the Greek and Latin tradition: "the inner self" and "the outer appearance" or, as viewed in a different context, "what one is to oneself" as opposed to "what one appears to be to one's observers." The inner person is **nepesh**, while the outer person, or reputation, is shem, most commonly translated "name." In narrative or historical passages of the Old Testament, **nepesh** can be translated as "life" or "self," as in Lev 17:11: "For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for [yourselves]...." Needless to say, the reading "soul" is meaningless in such a text.

But the situation in the numerous parallel poetic passages in which the term appears is much more difficult. The Greek Septuagint and the Latin Vulgate both simply use the Greek and Latin equivalent "soul," especially in the Psalms. The first occurrence is in Ps 3:2: "Many are saying of my soul, There is no deliverance for him in God" (NASB). The next occurrence is in Ps 6:3: "And my soul is greatly dismayed; But Thou, O Lord — how long?" (NASB). In both passages the parallel contrast is between **nepesh** and some aspect of the self, expressed as "him" in Ps 3:2 and not expressed but understood in Ps 6:3. There is no distinction as to whether it appears as an "A" or

"B" word in the parallelism. However, since Hebrew rejects repeating the same noun in both halves of a poetic line, **nepesh** is often used as the parallel for the speaker, primary personal subject, and even for God, as in Ps 11:5: "The Lord trieth the righteous: but the wicked and him that loveth violence [he himself] hateth." Such passages are frequent, and a proper understanding of the word enlightens many wellknown passages, such as Ps 119:109: "My life is continually in my hand, Yet I do not forget Thy law" (NASB).

The versions vary widely in their readings of **nepesh**, with the more contemporary versions casting widely for meanings.

B. Verb.

Napash means "to breathe; respire; be refreshed." This verb, which is apparently related to the noun **nepesh**, appears 3 times in the Old Testament Ex 23:12; 31:17. The other appearance is in 2 Sam 16:14: "And the king, and all the people that were with him, came weary and refreshed themselves there."

Greedy - Greek

FILTHINESS, FILTHY (TO MAKE)

A. Nouns.

1. aischrotes (NT:151), "baseness" (from aischos, "shame, disgrace"), is used in Eph 5:4, of obscenity, all that is contrary to purity.

2. rhuparia (NT:4507) denotes "dirt, filth" (cf. No. 2, under FILTH), and is used metaphorically of moral "defilement" in James 1:21.

3. **molusmos** (NT:3436), "a soiling, defilement," is used in 2 Cor 7:1. See DEFILEMENT.

4. aselgeia (NT:766), "wantonness, licentiousness, lasciviousness," is translated "filthy (conversation)," in 2 Peter 2:7, KJV; RV, lascivious (life). See LASCIVIOUSNESS, WANTONNESS.

Notes: (1) Broadly speaking, **aischrotes** signifies "whatever is disgraceful"; **rhuparia**, "that which is characterized by moral impurity", molumos, "that which is defiling by soiling the clean"; **aselgeia**, "that which is an insolent disregard of decency." (2) In Col 3:8 aischrologia, which denotes any kind of "base utterance," the utterance of an uncontrolled tongue, is rendered "filthy communication" in the KJV; but this is only part of what is included in the more comprehensive RV rendering, "shameful speaking." In the papyri writings the word is used of "abuse." In general it seems to have been associated more frequently with "foul" or "filthy," rather than abusive, "speaking" (Moulton and Milligan).

B. Adjectives.

1. aischros (NT:150), "base, shameful" (akin to A, No. 1), is used of "base gain," "filthy (lucre)," Titus 1:11, and translated "shame" in 1 Cor 11:6, with reference to a woman with shorn hair; in 14:35, of oral utterances of women in a church gathering (RV, "shameful"); in Eph 5:12, of mentioning the base and bestial practices of those who live lascivious lives. See SHAME.

2. aischrokerdes (NT:146), "greedy of base gain" (No. 1, and **kerdos**, "gain"), is used in 1 Tim 3:8 and Titus 1:7, "greedy of filthy lucre"; some mss. have it also in 1 Tim 3:3.

3. rhuparos (NT:4508), akin to A, No. 2 (see also FILTH, No. 2), "dirty," is said of shabby clothing, James 2:2: metaphorically, of moral "defilement," Rev 22:11 (in the best mss.).

Note: For akathartos see UNCLEAN, No. 1.

C. Adverb.

aischrokerdos (NT:147), "eagerness for base gain" (akin to B, No. 2), is used in 1 Peter 5:2, "for filthy lucre."

D. Verb.

rhupaino (NT:4510v), "to make filthy, defile" (from A, No. 2), is used in the passive voice, in an ethical sense, in Rev 22:11 (cf. B, No. 3, in the same verse), "let him be made filthy," RV. The tense (the aorist) marks the decisiveness of that which is decreed. Some texts have *rhupareuomai*, here, with the same meaning; some have *rhupoo*, in the middle voice, "to make oneself filthy.bv, "to make filthy, defile" (from A, No. 2), is used in the passive voice, in an ethical sense, in Rev 22:11 (cf. COVET, COVETOUS, COVETOUSNESS

A. Verbs.

1. epithumeo (NT:1937), "to fix the desire upon" (**epi**, "upon," used intensively, **thumos**, "passion"), whether things good or bad; hence, "to long for, lust after, covet," is used with the meaning "to covet evilly" in Acts 20:33, of "coveting money and apparel"; so in Rom 7:7; 13:9. See DESIRE, FAIN, LUST.

2. zeloo (NT:2206) is rendered "covet earnestly," in 1 Cor 12:31, KJV; RV, "desire earnestly," as in 14:39 (KJV "covet"). See AFFECT, DESIRE, ENVY, JEALOUS, ZEALOUS.

3. **orego** (NT:3713), "to stretch after," is rendered "covet after" in 1 Tim 6:10, KJV; RV. "reaching after." See DESIRE, REACH.

B. Nouns.

1. epithumetes (NT:1938), "a luster after" (akin to A, No. 1), is translated in 1 Cor 10:6, in verbal form, "should not lust after." See LUST.

2. epithumia (NT:1939) denotes "coveting," Rom 7:7-8, RV; KJV, "lust" and "concupiscence"; the commandment here referred to convicted him of sinfulness in his desires for unlawful objects besides that of gain. See DESIRE, LUST.

3. **pleonexia** (NT:4124), "covetousness," lit., "a desire to have more" (**pleon**, "more," **echo**, "to have"), always in a bad sense, is used in a general way in Mark 7:22 (plural, lit., "covetings," i. e., various ways in which "covetousness" shows itself); Rom 1:29; Eph 5:3; 1 Thess 2:5. Elsewhere it is used, (a) of material possessions, Luke 12:15; 2 Peter 2:3; 2 Cor 9:5 (RV, "extortion"), lit., "as (a matter of) extortion" i. e., a

gift which betrays the giver's unwillingness to bestow what is due; (b) of sensuality, Eph 4:19, "greediness"; Col 3:5 (where it is called "idolatry"); 2 Peter 2:14 (KJV, "covetous practices"). See EXTORTION.

Note: Cf. the corresponding verb **pleonekteo**, "to gain, take advantage of wrong." See ADVANTAGE, DEFRAUD, GAIN, B, Note (2), WRONG

C. Adjectives.

1. pleonektes (NT:4123), lit., "(eager) to have more" (see B, No. 3), i. e., to have what belongs to others; hence, "greedy of gain, covetous," 1 Cor 5:10-11; 6:10; Eph 5:5 ("covetous man").

2. philarguros (NT:5366), lit., "money-loving," is rendered "covetous" in the KJV of Luke 16:14 and 2 Tim 3:2; RV, "lovers of money," the wider and due significance.

3. **aphilarguros** (NT:866), No. 2, with negative prefix, is translated "without covetousness" in Heb 13:5, KJV; RV, "free from the love of money." In 1 Tim 3:3, the KJV has "not covetous," the RV, "no lover of money."

Note: Trench, Syn. Sec. 24, points out the main distinction between **pleonexia** and **philarguria** as being that between "covetousness" and avarice, the former having a much wider and deeper sense, being "the genus of which **philarguria** is the species." The "covetous" man is often cruel as well as grasping, while the avaricious man is simply miserly and stinting.
