

At first glance one might draw a false conclusion that reference to a Waster is an attitude but not a person. **However, there is scriptural clarity.**

Isaiah 54:16

Behold, I have created the smith that bloweth the coals in the fire, and that bringeth forth an instrument for his work; and I have created *the waster* to destroy.

The Hebrew word for "the Waster" above is "shachath." Shachath is a word for waster, waste, spoiler, spill, perish, destroy, corrupt. In Isaiah 54:16 we see a smith to create and a waster to destroy. It is easy to agree the smith is a person. This verse references that person with a skill.

What does this waster do?

Takes the assets of others. (A spoiler took the spoils after a battle.)

I Samuel 13:17

And *the spoilers* came out of the camp of the Philistines in three companies: one company turned unto the way that leadeth to Ophrah, unto the land of Shual:

A person who will waste a country.

I Chronicles 20:1

And it came to pass, that after the year was expired, at the time that kings go out to battle, Joab led forth the power of the army, *and wasted* the country of the children of Ammon, and came and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried at Jerusalem. And Joab smote Rabbah, and destroyed it.

A person who destroys/wastes his own soul: (i.e.) Mind, Will, Emotions.

Proverbs 6:32

But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding: he that doeth it *destroyeth* his own soul.

A person who by verbal ways or internet or blog destroys or waste another.

Proverbs 11:9

An hypocrite with his mouth *destroyeth* his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered.

The results obtained by a waster are the same as a slothful person. The results bring down a person, family, or company.

Proverbs 18:9

He also that is slothful in his work is brother to him that is a great *waster*.

To be afraid of a wicked person will corrupt or destroy or waste creativity (see teaching on Wicked People).

Proverbs 25:26

A righteous man falling down before the wicked is as a troubled fountain, and a *corrupt* spring.

To steal from parents is no different than a waster.

Proverbs 28:24

Whoso robbeth his father or his mother, and saith, It is no transgression; the same is the companion of *a destroyer*.

Wasting

This is partially a testimony and a teaching, but it is mostly an admonition from my personal experience.

I work in the housing and land development industry as a market researcher and consultant. My comments refer to the housing industry, however I believe they are applicable in all aspects of business. It is my belief the housing industry must be close to the greatest waster of any industry. To address waste we must learn the art of addressing little things. (He who is faithful in little things can be faithful in great.) One does not address this issue by being cheap nor being exceeding frugal but by getting things done right the first time through prudence (doing the right thing) and diligence (doing the thing right).

I suspect so far you have heard the above many times, I had also. Then our thought came to focus on the little things. We checked to be sure we were doing the right things. Then, of these right things being done we could then focus on the little things.

First was to list all the "right" little things and next to do a cost of business study for making mistakes. This means to figure out on each item the degree of efficiency and the cost of waste from a lack of efficiency, mistakes, or poor communication etc. Always focus on the little things. In the home building industry I have concluded that if one were to look at the net profit (before tax) not (looking at gross profit) it is reasonable to conclude you could increase the net profit easily 20% for an efficient company and 40% for a mostly well-run company to 107% for many companies.

At one point a company that was selected as one of the best run building companies in the United States concluded they could increase their net profit before tax number 107% without increasing sales prices or selling more homes. I believe other industries could also get similar results. Again the first focus is a cost of business study. Being sure you are doing the right things and then focusing on the little right things and their efficiency. Next is to look at each narrow category (such as delivering dry wall or hanging drywall or receptionist or opening a model daily etc.). Then "by only" focusing on the little things that tend to go wrong and make a list (not over 1 page per item – a rule).

Once the list is done by a key manager with advice from others, then the head person examines every list no matter the size of the corporation (this person must agree). Then that one-page list is used to evaluate the function and process, for example: hanging drywall or on a per month basis for things such as receptionist. This is then put on a 1-page tracking form with the date or lot number on the bottom of a chart and the mistakes on the left. The goal is to only track the errors or what is called noncompliance. Therefore, the right small things are identified first. The head person agrees with the list (and does not delegate the final list decision). Quality is then defined as conforming to the requirements on the list. The list is on a simple 1-page chart now used as a check list, then evaluated by project or date, then tracked. It should not have over 2 pages per function. The result is a

system to make the little things (as decided by the head person) identified, accountable, measured and acted upon.

I do not know how many years these teachings on Proverbs and the 70 types of People identified that Solomon talked about will be around. It may outlive me. Therefore this next statement may not be always applicable.

And it came to pass, that after the year was expired, at the time that kings go out to battle, Joab led forth the power of the army, *and wasted* the country of the children of Ammon, and came and besieged Rabbah. But David tarried at Jerusalem. And Joab smote Rabbah, and destroyed it.

I Chronicles 21:12

Either three years' famine; or three months to be destroyed before thy foes, while that the sword of thine enemies overtaketh thee; or else three days the sword of the LORD, even the pestilence, in the land, and the angel of the LORD *destroying* throughout all the coasts of Israel. Now therefore advise thyself what word I shall bring again to him that sent me.

I Chronicles 21:15

And God sent an angel unto Jerusalem *to destroy it*: *and as he was destroying*, the LORD beheld, and he repented him of the evil, and said to the angel *that destroyed*, It is enough, stay now thine hand. And the angel of the LORD stood by the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite.

II Chronicles 12:7

And when the LORD saw that they humbled themselves, the word of the LORD came to Shemaiah, saying, They have humbled themselves; therefore *I will* not *destroy* them, but I will grant them some deliverance; and my wrath shall not be poured out upon Jerusalem by the hand of Shishak.

II Chronicles 12:12

And when he humbled himself, the wrath of the LORD turned from him that *he would* not *destroy* him altogether: and also in Judah things went well.

II Chronicles 21:7

Howbeit the LORD would not *destroy* the house of David, because of the covenant that he had made with David, and as he promised to give a light to him and to his sons for ever.

II Chronicles 24:23

And it came to pass at the end of the year, that the host of Syria came up against him: and they came to Judah and Jerusalem, *and destroyed* all the princes of the people from among the people, and sent all the spoil of them unto the king of Damascus.

II Chronicles 25:16

And it came to pass, as he talked with him, that the king said unto him, Art thou made of the king's counsel? forbear; why shouldest thou be smitten? Then the prophet forbare, and said, I know that God hath determined *to destroy thee*, because thou hast done this, and hast not hearkened unto my counsel.

II Chronicles 26:16

But when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his **destruction**: for he transgressed against the LORD his God, and went into the temple of the LORD to burn incense upon the altar of incense.

II Chronicles 27:2

And he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father Uzziah did: howbeit he entered not into the temple of the LORD. And the people *did* yet *corruptly.*

II Chronicles 34:11

Even to the artificers and builders gave they it, to buy hewn stone, and timber for couplings, and to floor the houses which the kings of Judah *had destroyed*.

II Chronicles 35:21

But he sent ambassadors to him, saying, What have I to do with thee, thou king of Judah? I come not against thee this day, but against the house wherewith I have war: for God commanded me to make haste: forbear thee from meddling with God, who is with me, that *he destroy thee* not.

II Chronicles 36:19

And they burnt the house of God, and brake down the wall of Jerusalem, and burnt all the palaces thereof with fire, and *destroyed* all the goodly vessels thereof.

Proverbs 6:32

But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding: he that doeth it *destroyeth* his own soul.

Proverbs 11:9

An hypocrite with his mouth *destroyeth* his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered.

Proverbs 18:9

He also that is slothful in his work is brother to him that is a great *waster*.

Proverbs 23:8

The morsel which thou hast eaten shalt thou vomit up, *and lose* thy sweet words.

Proverbs 25:26

A righteous man falling down before the wicked is as a troubled fountain, and a *corrupt* spring.

Proverbs 28:24

Whoso robbeth his father or his mother, and saith, It is no transgression; the same is the companion of *a destroyer*.

Isaiah 54:16

Behold, I have created the smith that bloweth the coals in the fire, and that bringeth forth an instrument for his work; and I have created *the waster* to destroy.

Psalms 14:1

The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. *They are corrupt*, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.

Psalms 53:1

The fool hath said in his heart, There is *no God. Corrupt* are they, and have done abominable iniquity: there is none that doeth good.

Psalms 78:38

And thou shalt say to Jehoiakim the king of Judah, Thus saith the LORD ; Thou hast burned this roll, saying, Why hast thou written therein, saying, The king of Babylon shall certainly *come and destroy* this land, and shall cause to cease from thence man and beast?

Jeremiah 48:18

Thou daughter that dost inhabit Dibon, come down from thy glory, and sit in thirst; for the spoiler of Moab shall come upon thee, and *he shall destroy* thy strong holds.

Jeremiah 49:9

If grapegatherers come to thee, would they not leave some gleaning grapes? if thieves by night, *they will destroy* till they have enough.

Jeremiah 51:1

hus saith the LORD ; Behold, I will raise up against Babylon, and against them that dwell in the midst of them that rise up against me, a *destroying* wind;

Jeremiah 51:11

Make bright the arrows; gather the shields: the LORD hath raised up the spirit of the kings of the Medes: for his device is against Babylon, *to destroy it*; because it is the vengeance of the LORD, the vengeance of his temple.

Jeremiah 51:20

Thou art my battle axe and weapons of war: for with thee will I break in pieces the nations, *and* with thee *will I destroy* kingdoms;

Jeremiah 51:25

Behold, I am against thee, O destroying mountain, saith the LORD , *which destroyest* all the earth: and I will stretch out mine hand upon thee, and roll thee down from the rocks, and will make thee a burnt mountain.

Lamentations 2:5-6

The Lord was as an enemy: he hath swallowed up Israel, he hath swallowed up all her palaces: *he hath destroyed* his strong holds, and hath increased in the daughter of Judah mourning and lamentation. ⁶ And he hath violently taken away his tabernacle, as if it were of a garden: *he hath destroyed* his places of the assembly: the LORD hath caused the solemn feasts and sabbaths to be forgotten in Zion, and hath despised in the indignation of his anger the king and the priest.

Lamentations 2:8

The LORD hath purposed *to destroy* the wall of the daughter of Zion: he hath stretched out a line, he hath not withdrawn his hand from destroying: therefore he made the rampart and the wall to lament; they languished together.

Ezekiel 5:16

When I shall send upon them the evil arrows of famine, which shall be for their destruction, and which I will send *to destroy* you: and I will increase the famine upon you, and will break your staff of bread:

Ezekiel 9:8

And it came to pass, while they were slaying them, and I was left, that I fell upon my face, and cried, and said, Ah Lord GOD ! *wilt* thou *destroy* all the residue of Israel in thy pouring out of thy fury upon Jerusalem?

Ezekiel 16:47

Yet hast thou not walked after their ways, nor done after their abominations: *but*, as if that were a very little thing, *thou wast corrupted* more than they in all thy ways.

Ezekiel 20:17

Nevertheless mine eye spared them *from destroying them*, neither did I make an end of them in the wilderness.

And ye shall know that I am the LORD, when I have wrought with you for my name's sake, not according to your wicked ways, nor according to your *corrupt* doings, O ye house of Israel, saith the Lord GOD.

Ezekiel 22:30

And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that *I should* not *destroy* it: but I found none.

Ezekiel 23:11

And when her sister Aholibah saw this, *she was more corrupt* in her inordinate love than she, and in her whoredoms more than her sister in her whoredoms.

Ezekiel 26:4

And they shall destroy the walls of Tyrus, and break down her towers: I will also scrape her dust from her, and make her like the top of a rock.

Ezekiel 28:17

Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, *thou hast corrupted* thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness: I will cast thee to the ground, I will lay thee before kings, that they may behold thee.

Ezekiel 30:11

He and his people with him, the terrible of the nations, shall be brought *to destroy* the land: and they shall draw their swords against Egypt, and fill the land with the slain.

Ezekiel 43:3

And it was according to the appearance of the vision which I saw, even according to the vision that I saw when I came *to destroy* the city: and the visions were like the vision that I saw by the river Chebar; and I fell upon my face.

Daniel 8:24-25

And his power shall be mighty, but not by his own power: and *he shall destroy* wonderfully, and shall prosper, and practise, and shall destroy the mighty and the holy people. ²⁵ And through his policy also he shall cause craft to prosper in his hand; and he shall magnify himself in his heart, and by peace *shall destroy* many: he shall also stand up against the Prince of princes; but he shall be broken without hand.

Daniel 9:26

And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come *shall destroy* the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined.

Daniel 11:17

He shall also set his face to enter with the strength of his whole kingdom, and upright ones with him; thus shall he do: and he shall give him the daughter of women, *corrupting her*: but she shall not stand on his side, neither be for him.

These are the inheritances which Eleazar the priest, and Joshua the son of Nun, and the heads of the fathers of the tribes of the children of Israel, divided for an inheritance by lot in Shiloh before the Lord, at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. *So they made an end of* dividing the country.

Joshua 24:20

If ye forsake the Lord, and serve strange gods, then he will turn and do you hurt, *and consume* you, after that he hath done you good.

Judges 3:18

And when he *had made an end to* offer the present, he sent away the people that bare the present.

And Solomon made affinity with Pharaoh king of Egypt, and took Pharaoh's daughter, and brought her into the city of David, until *he had made an end* of building his own house, and the house of the Lord, and the wall of Jerusalem round about.

I Kings 6:9

So he built the house, *and finished it*; and covered the house with beams and boards of cedar.

I Kings 6:14

So Solomon built the house, *and finished it*.

I Kings 6:38

And in the eleventh year, in the month Bul, which is the eighth month, *was* the house *finished* throughout all the parts thereof, and according to all the fashion of it. So was he seven years in building it.

I Kings 7:1

But Solomon was building his own house thirteen years, *and he finished* all his house.

I Kings 7:40

And Hiram made the lavers, and the shovels, and the basons. *So* Hiram *made an end* of doing all the work that he made king Solomon for the house of the Lord:

I Kings 8:54

And it was so, that *when* Solomon *had made an end of* praying all this prayer and supplication unto the Lord, he arose from before the altar of the Lord, from kneeling on his knees with his hands spread up to heaven.

I Kings 9:1

And it came to pass, *when* Solomon *had finished* the building of the house of the Lord, and the king's house, and all Solomon's desire which he was pleased to do,

I Kings 17:14

For thus saith the Lord God of Israel, The barrel of meal *shall* not *waste*, neither shall the cruse of oil fail, until the day that the Lord sendeth rain upon the earth.

I Kings 17:16

And the barrel of meal *wasted* not, neither did the cruse of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord, which he spake by Elijah.

I Kings 22:11

And Zedekiah the son of Chenaanah made him horns of iron: and he said, Thus saith the Lord, With these shalt thou push the Syrians, until *thou have consumed them*.

II Kings 10:25

And it came to pass, *as soon as he had made an end* of offering the burnt offering, that Jehu said to the guard and to the captains, Go in, and slay them; let none come forth. A Waster – Hebrew

TO DESTROY

shamad "to destroy, annihilate, exterminate." This biblical word occurs also in modern Hebrew, with the root having the connotation of "religious persecution" or "forced conversion." **Shamad** is found 90 times in the Hebrew Old Testament, the first time in Gen 34:30: "I shall be destroyed."

This word always expresses complete "destruction" or "annihilation." While the word is often used to express literal "destruction" of people Deut 2:12; Judg 21:16, **shamad** frequently is part of an open threat or warning given to the people of Israel, promising "destruction" if they forsake God for idols (cf. Deut 4:25-26). This word also expresses the complete "destruction" of the pagan high places Hos 10:8 of Baal and his images II Kings 10:28. When God wants to completely "destroy," He will sweep "with the [broom] of destruction" Isa 14:23.

shachat "to corrupt, spoil, ruin, mar, destroy." Used primarily in biblical Hebrew, this word has cognate forms in a few other Semitic languages such as Aramaic and Ethiopic. It is used about 150 times in the Hebrew Bible and is found first in Gen 6, where it is used 4 times in reference to the "corruption" that prompted God to bring the Flood upon the earth Gen 6:11-12,17.

Anything that is good can be "corrupted" or "spoiled," such as Jeremiah's loincloth Jer 13:7, a vineyard Jer 12:10, cities Gen 13:10, and a temple Lam 2:6. **Shachat** has the meaning of "to waste" when used of words that are inappropriately spoken Prov 23:8. In its participial form, the word is used to describe a "ravening lion" Jer 2:30, RSV and the "destroying angel" 1 Chron 21:15. The word is used as a symbol for a trap in Jer 5:26. **Shachat** is used frequently by the prophets in the sense of "to corrupt morally" Isa 1:4; Ezek 23:11; Zeph 3:7.

TO BE DESOLATE

shamem "to be desolate, astonished, appalled, devastated, ravaged." This verb is found in both biblical and modern Hebrew. It occurs approximately 90 times in the text of the Hebrew Old Testament. **Shamem** does not occur until Lev 26:22: "Your high ways shall be desolate." Interestingly, the word occurs 25 times in the Book of Ezekiel alone, which may reflect either Ezekiel's times or (more likely) his personality.

Just how the meanings "be desolate," "be astonished," and "be appalled" are to be connected with each other is not clear. In some instances, the translator must make a subjective choice. For example, after being raped by her half-brother, Tamar is said to

have remained in her brother Absalom's house, "desolate" 2 Sam 13:20. However, she surely was "appalled" at what Amnon had done. Also, the traditional expression, "to be desolated," sometimes means much the same as "to be destroyed" (cf. Amos 7:9; Ezek 6:4).

Shamem often expresses the idea of to "devastate" or "ravage": "I will destroy her vines" Hos 2:12. What one sees sometimes is so horrible that it "horrifies" or "appalls": "Mark me, and be astonished, and lay your hand upon your mouth [i. e., be speechless]" Job 21:5.

kalah "to cease, be finished, perish, be completed." This verb occurs in most Semitic languages and in all periods. In Hebrew, it occurs both in the Bible (about 210 times) and in post-biblical literature. The word does not appear in biblical Aramaic.

Basically, the word means "to cease or stop." **Kalah** may refer to the "end" of a process or action, such as the cessation of God's creating the universe: "And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made..." Gen 2:2 — the first occurrence of the word. The word can also refer to the "disappearance" of something: "And the water was spent in the bottle..." Gen 21:15. Finally, **kalah** can be used of "coming to an end" or "the process of ending": "The barrel of meal shall not waste" 1 Kings 17:14.

Kalah can have the more positive connotation of "successfully completing" something. First Kings 6:38 says that the house of the Lord was "finished throughout all the parts thereof, and according to all [its plans]." In this same sense, the word of the Lord "is fulfilled": "Now in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah might be fulfilled, the Lord stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, that he made a proclamation..." Ezra 1:1.

Kalah sometimes means "making a firm decision." David tells Jonathan that if Saul is very angry, "be sure that evil is determined by him" 1 Sam 20:7.

Negatively, "to complete" something may mean "to make it vanish" or "go away." **Kalah** is used in this sense in Deut 32:23, when God says: "I will heap mischiefs upon them; I will spend mine arrows upon them." In other words, His arrows will "vanish" from His possession. This nuance is used especially of clouds: "As the cloud is consumed and vanisheth away..." Job 7:9. Another negative nuance is to "destroy" something or someone: "the famine shall consume the land" Gen 41:30. Along this same line is the use of **kalah** in Isa 1:28: "...they that forsake the Lord shall be consumed"; here, however, the verb is a synonym for "dying" or "perishing." One's sight may also "vanish" and one may go blind: "But the eyes of the wicked shall fail, and they shall not escape..." Job 11:20. An altogether different emphasis appears when one's heart comes "to an end" or "stops within": "My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the Lord" Ps 84:2; the psalmist probably meant that his desire for God's presence was so intense that nothing else had any meaning for him — he "died" to be there.
