

GRACE

(A Short Testimony)

Over a period of time, I have studied and restudied the words: grace, gracious, and graciousness. Some years ago, after several months with mostly daily study, I thought I had a good concept of what grace was (over about one hundred twenty hours of study) but all I had was *limited knowledge*_and little understanding.

Let me describe the difference between knowledge and understanding. *I "know" the sun is up there but I do not "understand" how it is there.* I had *much knowledge* and little understanding.

I was asked by my pastor to go to upper Michigan to handle a Sunday church service of a start up church, as that pastor was going to our church in Green Bay to preach and gain support for the start-up work. On the way to upper Michigan, I was explaining to another person riding with me what grace was when the Lord opened the door of my heart to understanding. I started to cry so hard I could not drive. It must have gone on for more than 30 minutes.

Be careful when you think you understand and all you have is knowledge. Knowledge puffs up. Understanding is at the end to see a thing in a simple way.

GRACE

The standard definition of grace is "God's unmerited favor". This is correct; however I wonder how many even grasp this concept. Many of these 70-word studies have been designed to be a **starting point** for a person to study, not only to read as a teaching.

In regards to the Greek word **Charis**, (generally rendered grace) I have decided to encourage you to memorize and meditate on all the scripture so that you may go from knowledge to understanding which will set you free. Hopefully as you read these insights into the Greek word **Charis** you will be encouraged to study and meditate more on your own.

INSIGHTS

1. Grace comes from:

- loving those who do not return it OR
- doing good to those who did not do good toward you first OR
- giving with no expectation of return.

Luke 6:32-34

For if ye love them which love you, what *thank* have ye? for sinners also love those that love them. ³³ And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what *thank* have ye? for sinners also do even the same. ³⁴ And if ye lend to them of whom ye hope to receive, what *thank* have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again.

2. It is doing when you do not have to do

Luke 17:9

Doth he *thank* that servant because he did the things that were commanded him? I trow not.

3. Grace finds its way into faith

Acts 6:8

And Stephen, full *of faith* and power, did great wonders and miracles among the people.

4. Grace in action can be seen

Acts 11:23

Who, when he came, and had seen the *grace* of God, was glad, and exhorted them all, that with purpose of heart they would cleave unto the Lord.

Life is also a relative term. You can have more or less life. (i.e.) that you would have "life" and more abundantly.

Our Tense of the Word

A Hebrew word for graciously interceding for another or yourself. At times it is used for God interceding for you or others, (i.e.) asking for help in a gracious manner. It is the "action" of approaching another tenderly. This word has in it the action of doing.

Genesis 33:5

And he lifted up his eyes, and saw the women and the children; and said, Who are those with thee? And he said, The children which God *hath graciously given* thy servant.

Genesis 33:11

Take, I pray thee, my blessing that is brought to thee; because God *hath dealt graciously with me*, and because I have enough. And he urged him, and he took it.

Genesis 42:21

And they said one to another, We are verily guilty concerning our brother, in that we saw the anguish of his soul, *when he besought* us, and we would not hear; therefore is this distress come upon us.

Genesis 43:29

And he lifted up his eyes, and saw his brother Benjamin, his mother's son, and said, Is this your younger brother, of whom ye spake unto me? And he said, God **be gracious unto thee**, my son.

Exodus 33:19

A Gracious Person - Hebrew

TO BE GRACIOUS, SHOW FAVOR

A. Verb.

chanan, "to be gracious, considerate; to show favor." This word is found in ancient Ugaritic with much the same meaning as in biblical Hebrew. But in modern Hebrew **chanan** seems to stress the stronger meaning of "to pardon or to show mercy." The word occurs around 80 times in the Hebrew Old Testament, the first time in Gen 33:5: "The children which God hath graciously given thy servant." Generally, this word implies the extending of "favor," often when it is neither expected nor deserved. **Chanan** may express "generosity," a gift from the heart Ps 37:21. God especially is the source of undeserved "favor" Gen 33:11, and He is asked repeatedly for such "gracious" acts as only He can do Num 6:25; Gen 43:29. The psalmist prays: "...grant me thy law graciously" Ps 119:29.

God's "favor" is especially seen in His deliverance from one's enemies or surrounding evils Ps 77:9; Amos 5:15. However, God extends His "graciousness" in His own sovereign way and will, to whomever He chooses Ex 33:19.

In many ways, **chanan** combines the meaning of the Greek *haris* (with the general classical Greek sense of "charm" or "graciousness") and the New Testament sense of "undeserved favor" or "mercy."

B. Noun.

chen, "favor; grace." The root with the meaning "to favor someone" is a common Semitic term. In Akkadian, the verb *enenu* ("to have compassion") is related to *hinnu* ("favor"), which occurs only as a proper noun. The Hebrew noun **chen** occurs 69 times, mainly in the Pentateuch and in the historical books through Samuel. The word's frequency increases in the poetic books, but it is rare in the prophetic books. The first occurrence is in Gen 6:8: "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord."

The basic meaning of **chen** is "favor." Whatever is "pleasant and agreeable" can be described by this word. When a woman is said to have **chen**, she is a "gracious" woman Prov 11:16; or the word may have the negative association of being "beautiful without sense" Prov 31:30. A person's speech may be characterized by "graciousness": "He that loveth pureness of heart, for the grace of his lips the king shall be his friend" Prov 22:11; cf. Ps 45:2.

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Chen also denotes the response to whatever is "agreeable." The verbs used with "favor" are: "give favor" Gen 39:21, "obtain favor" Ex 3:21, and "find favor" Gen 6:8, RSV. The idioms are equivalent to the English verbs "to like" or "to love": "[She] said to him, Why have I found favor in your eyes, that you should take notice of me, when I am a foreigner?" Ruth 2:10, RSV.

The Septuagint translations are: *charis* ("grace; favor; graciousness; attractiveness") and *eleos* ("mercy; compassion; pity").

C. Adjective.

channun "gracious." One of the word's 13 occurrences is in Ex 34:6: "And the Lord passed by before him [Moses], and proclaimed, The Lord, The Lord God, merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth...."

chrestos is rendered "gracious" in **I Peter** 2:3, as an attribute of the Lord. See EASY, GOOD, KIND.

Note: Euphemos, "fair-sounding" (eu, "well," pheme, "a saying, or report"), "of good report," Phil 4:8, is rendered "gracious" in the RV marg.

GRACE

1. charis has various uses, (a) objective, that which bestows or occasions pleasure, delight, or causes favorable regard; it is applied, e.g., to beauty, or gracefulness of person, Luke 2:40; act, 2 Cor 8:6, or speech, Luke 4:22, RV, "words of grace" (KJV, "gracious words"); Col 4:6; (b) subjective, (1) on the part of the bestower, the friendly disposition from which the kindly act proceeds, graciousness, lovingkindness, goodwill generally, e. g., Acts 7:10; especially with reference to the divine favor or "grace," e. g., Acts 14:26; in this respect there is stress on its freeness and universality, its spontaneous character, as in the case of God's redemptive mercy, and the pleasure or joy He designs for the recipient; thus it is set in contrast with debt, Rom 4:4,16, with works, 11:6, and with law, John 1:17; see also, e. g., Rom 6:14,15; Gal 5:4; (2) on the part of the receiver, a sense of the favor bestowed, a feeling of gratitude, e. g., Rom 6:17 ("thanks"); in this respect it sometimes signifies "to be thankful," e.g., Luke 17:9 ("doth he thank the servant?" lit., "hath he thanks to"); 1 Tim 1:12; (c) in another objective sense, the effect of "grace," the spiritual state of those who have experienced its exercise, whether (1) a state of "grace," e. g., Rom 5:2; I Peter 5:12; II Peter 3:18, or (2) a proof thereof in practical effects. deeds of "grace," e. g., 1 Cor 16:3, RV, "bounty" (KJV, "liberality"); 2 Cor 8:6,19 (in 2 Cor 9:8 it means the sum of earthly blessings); the power and equipment for ministry, e. g., Rom 1:5; 12:6; 15:15; 1 Cor 3:10; Gal 2:9; Eph 3:2,7.

To be in favor with is to find "grace" with, e. g., Acts 2:47; hence it appears in this sense at the beginning and the end of several epistles, where the writer desires "grace" from God for the readers, e. g., Rom 1:7; 1 Cor 1:3; in this respect it is connected with the imperative mood of the word **chairo**, "to rejoice," a mode of greeting among Greeks, e. g., Acts 15:23; James 1:1 (marg.); 2 John 10,11, RV, "greeting" (KJV, "God speed").

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The fact that "grace" is received both from God the Father, 2 Cor 1:12, and from Christ, Gal 1:6; Rom 5:15 (where both are mentioned), is a testimony to the deity of Christ. See also 2 Thess 1:12, where the phrase "according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ" is to be taken with each of the preceding clauses, "in you," "and ye in Him."

In James 4:6, "But He giveth more grace" (Greek, "a greater grace," RV, marg.), the statement is to be taken in connection with the preceding verse, which contains two remonstrating, rhetorical questions, "Think ye that the Scripture speaketh in vain?" and "Doth the Spirit (the Holy Spirit) which He made to dwell in us long unto envying?" (see the RV). The implied answer to each is "it cannot be so." Accordingly, if those who are acting so flagrantly, as if it were so, will listen to the Scripture instead of letting it speak in vain, and will act so that the Holy Spirit may have His way within, God will give even "a greater grace," namely, all that follows from humbleness and from turning away from the world. See BENEFIT, BOUNTY, LIBERALITY, THANK.

Note: The corresponding verb **charitoo**, "to endue with divine favor or grace," is used in Luke 1:28, "highly favored" (marg., "endued with grace") and Eph 1:6, KJV, "hath made... accepted"; RV, "freely bestowed" (marg., "endued.").

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- **1.** Xara/ occurs 59 times in the NT, and is esp. common in Matthew (6 occurrences), Luke (8), John (9), and in Paul (19, 5 each in **II Corinthians** and Philippians, none in **I Corinthians**). Although in most NT occurrences joy is a primary mode of the appropriation of the eschatological event of salvation by human beings, it can also be the reaction of God or of his representatives to this appropriation.
- **2.** If "Spirit" constitutes God's most characteristic presence in the world, then joy is to a large extent the result of God's presence among human beings. The Spirit generates joy, along with righteousness and peace, as its fruit (Gal 5:22; Rom 14:17). It enables a person to endure joyfully the suffering and trials of Christian existence (1 Thess 1:6). Being filled with joy and the Spirit is itself a sign of the legitimacy of the mission to the Gentiles (Acts 13:52 after 13:47f., 50f.). Cf. also Luke 10:21 (exultation in the Holy Spirit over the criteria for election) and the inspiration of joy according to Philo (*Som.* ii.249; *Abr.* 201). Hence joy in this world is viewed as a witness to the activity of God himself. Cf. also 1 Clem. 63:2 [ET]; *Herm. Vis.* iii.13.2 [ETT] (renewal of the pneuma through joy).
- **3.** NT use of "joy" shows particularly that the addressee is a constituent part of the revelatory event itself and participates in it within the mode of (divinely induced) joy. Thus "the word" is "received" with joy (Mark 4:16 par.; 1 Thess 1:6). One accepts with joy the renunciations that accompany conversion (1 Thess 1:6; Heb 10:34). Heb 10:34 and Matt 13:44 speak of the joy that can accompany even the loss of one's possessions. The good news or words of authority can call forth joy (Luke 2:10: eu)aggeli/zomai; 1 John 1:4; 2 John 12). According to 2 Cor 1:24 and Phil 1:25 joy and faith run parallel, or joy is the way in which faith is present apart from "progress."

Those who see visions react with joy (Matt 28:8; Luke 24:41,52, after the ascension). Joy can also be the reaction to miraculous signs: a star (Matt 2:10), the apostles' own deeds (Luke 10:17), or miracles (Acts 8:7f.; 12:14). The mission to the Gentiles is a miraculous process and thus results in joy (Acts 15:3; Rom 15:32; cf. Acts 13:52). The formulation in **I Peter** 1:8 shows to what degree joy is understood as divinely effected participation in the heavenly world: "Without having seen him you believe and rejoice with unutterable and glorious joy."

Thus prayer and joy are intimately connected (Phil 1:4; Col 1:11f.). Luke 1:14 says about John the Baptist that "he will be your joy and your gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth," thus identifying him as a prophet of revelation (cf. *Bib. Ant.* 51:6f. [on Samuel]: "Sing praises . . . because of the miracles God has performed for you. . . . Sing praises for the Lord's miracles. . . . And they departed and went out with mirth, rejoicing and exulting in heart for all the glory that God had brought about for them. . . . Let the prophet live among the people. . . . "

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4. Like the vb. the noun xara/ can also be used in imperatives (fruit of the Spirit, Gal 5:22; with righteousness in Rom 14:17; further Phil 2:18f., cf. v. 2). Thus, in disagreement with the prevailing modern understanding, joy primarily refers not to an involuntary and internal "emotion" but, like "righteousness" and "peace," to comprehensive, value-centered, complex behavior (such as friendliness, generosity, self-sacrifice, overcoming of adversity), which like "righteousness" can stand for the sum of Christian behavior (e.g., 2 Cor 1:24; also 13:11). Cf. also Philo *Mut.* 167 (whoever has virtue also has constant joy).

5. Again like the noun is used of Christian behavior in the face of unjust suffering and tribulation as the overcoming of such adversity: joy in the midst of grief and temptation and perseverance in faith as the result of faith itself (**I Peter** 1:6-8); joy in time of temptation and testing of faith, often with patience (James 1:2 [like **I Peter** 1]); joy overcoming the affliction that accompanies acceptance of the word (1 Thess 1:6 [like **I Peter** and James referring to the consequences of conversion]); joyous renunciation of possessions — probably loss of property resulting from conversion (Heb 10:34).

According to Pauline dialectic (wretchedness as the prerequisite for God's merciful activity) the apostle, too, can thus experience joy for just this reason amid all affliction (2 Cor 7:4). For the Church also, perseverance amid affliction has resulted in joy, and poverty has resulted in a wealth of generosity (8:2). Similarly, in Col 1:11 joy stands next to the power of patience and endurance.

Heb 12:2 views Christ's suffering as a preliminary stage toward the joy that lay before him, and v. 11 applies this to the Church's present discipline (similar to 1QH 9:24f.). Yet these two instances are different from the Pauline passages precisely because they do not refer to the joy that is able to overcome even now, in the present.

In contrast, Matt 5:11f.; James 1:2,12; **I Peter** 4:13f. emphasize again that there is an intimate relationship between a pronouncement of blessing for the present suffering of the righteous and the accompanying element of joy.

The fundamental theological concept behind all these statements about "joy in suffering" (or joy after suffering) is that in view of the antithesis between this unrighteous age and the coming age of righteousness the present suffering and persecution of the righteous constitutes for them a reason for joy. Righteousness virtually proves itself in such persecution. But this understanding does not always maintain a connection to the suffering and glory of Christ (though I Peter 1:11 does, after 1:6-8); we are dealing here with two mutually independent parallel ideas that found expression in various ways, including in the idea of the election of the poor and humble.

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- **6.** Joy is the subjective component of appropriation of the eschatological salvation promise. The term is thus parallel to "the kingdom of God," as seen in the correspondence between Matt 25:21,23 ("Enter into the *joy* of your master") and Rom 14:17 ("The kingdom of God consists *in . . . joy . . .*") and as attested by Heb 12:2. The relationship between joy and crown in 1 Thess 2:19f. and Phil 4:1 clearly refers to the parousia (judgment; thus also to the advent of the kingdom). Concerning joy as a salvation promise cf. K. Berger, *ZNW* 65 (1974) 198 n.33 (sources), esp. also *1 Enoch* (Greek) 5:9 ("years of their joy filled in exultation and peace"); 103:3 (joy and honor for the souls of the deceased righteous).
- **7.** Joy is also the reaction of the one who brings or effects salvation to the acceptance of that salvation, whether that be God (Luke 15:7,10, cf. Ezek 18:23; antithetical example in *t. Sanh.* 14:10), the bridegroom and his friend in joy over the wedding = time of salvation (John 3:29), on the part of the apostle over his congregation (1 Thess 3:9; 2 Cor 2:3; 7:13; Phil 1:4; 2:2; 4:1; cf. also Heb 13:17; Philem 7).
- **8.** Joy is viewed negatively when as a sign of penitence and humility it should turn to weeping (James 5:9). Thus the joy of the unrighteous who have not yet repented stands over against the present sorrow of the righteous (John 16:20-22) and the joy of the righteous in suffering (225).
- **9.** "Joy" often appears with plhro/w: Persons are often filled with joy, or joy is made "perfect" (i.e., endowed with eschatological quality). Qli=yi\$ is the antithesis of joy (2 Cor 7:4; 8:2; John 16:21), which also appears in phrases with the root periss- (2 Cor 7:4; 8:2).

charisma (khar'-is-mah); from NT:5483; a (divine) gratuity, i.e. deliverance (from danger or passion); (specifically) a (spiritual) endowment, i.e. (subjectively) religious qualification, or (objectively) miraculous faculty:**KJV** - (free) gift.

- **1.** Xa/risma occurs 17 times in the NT, all in the letters: those of Paul (6 times in Romans, 7 in **I Corinthians**, and 2 Cor 1:11), the Pastorals (1 Tim 4:14; 2 Tim 1:6), and **I Peter** 4:10.

Before the NT the word apparently occurred only rarely. Philo (*All.* iii.78: "For all things in the world and the world itself is a free gift [dwrea/] and act of kindness [eu)ergesi/a] and grace [xa/risma] on God's part" — parallel to xa/ri\$) and Alciphro (iii.17.4: xa/risma dou\\$ e&xein) are the most important attestations, to which perhaps also *T. Sol.* recension C 13:14 may be added (magical gifts beneficial to health and wealth); although *Sib. Or.* ii.154 is probably

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contemporaneous with Christianity (the soul as divine xa/risma may not be defiled), its substance is not comprehensible from the perspective of the NT.

2. The oldest Christian usage of xa/risma in the sense of individual gifts occurs throughout **I Corinthians** and in Rom 12:6; **I Peter** 4:10. The basic premise is that there are different charismata (**I Peter** 4:10: "varied grace"; Rom 12:6: "different charismata") and that each person (e%kasto\$, **I Peter** 4:10; 1 Cor 7:7; 12:7: "to each") has his own (i&dio\$, 1 Cor 7:7). These texts exhibit a tendency toward sequential enumeration of various charismata (1 Cor 1:5: speech and knowledge; 12:8-10,28,29f. [in all three lists in 1 Cor 12 xari/smata is used only of healing]; Rom 12:6-8; **I Peter** 4:11: speech and service).

The variety of charismata can also be summarized under a unity. In 1 Cor 12:4 this is the one Spirit (cf. v. 7: to each is given the revelation of the Spirit) and in v. 5 the one Lord; the one Spirit apportions to each as he wills (v. 11). In Rom 12:4f. this unity is (as in 1 Cor 12:12) likened to one body with many members. **I Peter** 4:11 focuses on the glorification of God by all. The agreement between Rom 12:6f. and **I Peter** 4:11 extends further, since each (with w(\$ or e)n) provides the standard according to which the charismata are to be realized. Furthermore, in Rom 12:6 the first-mentioned, "prophecy" and "service," correspond to "speech" and "service" in **I Peter** 4:11.

Xa/ri\$ is also a uniquely employed quantity in these texts (Rom 12:6; **I Peter** 4:10; 1 Cor 1:4); its concrete development is the individual charisma. The model for this division is the tradition following Isa 11:2 concerning the various spiritual gifts (cf. K. Berger, *Exegese des NT* [UTB 658, ²1983] 46-48), of which the most familiar development is Armenian Ps.-Philo *De Sampsone* (German tr. by F. Siegert [1980] 24f.). The connection between charismata and Spirit is also attested by 1 Cor 12:4,9,11 as well as by the designation pneumatika/ in 12:1 and 14:1. Only in these two instances, however, does Paul cautiously call charismata pneumatika/, which he otherwise calls simply xari/smata, probably in order to distinguish adequately the Spirit as the effective cause and mediator of the individual effects from the charismata themselves.

These findings show that 2 Tim 1:6f. also belongs to this textual group; the relationship between spiritual gifts and charismata is the reverse of that in 1 Cor 12: The one charisma subdivides into the Spirit of power, love, and understanding. Outside this tradition, Rom 1:11 also associates the Spirit with xa/risma.

The gifts of healing apparently played a special role in Corinth, since in 1 Cor 12 (vss. 9,28,30) only they are called charismata, and probably bestowed special standing (since they were most useful; cf. the Gospel tradition). 12:31 should be understood either as a critical indicative, such that such striving is countered by love as the sign of all true spiritual gifts, or as an imperative portraying love as the principle of the other charismata. In any case, 1 Cor 14 is a concretization of 12:31a.

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- **3.** Rom 5:15f.; 6:23; 11:29 are quite closely related, since although they all focus on concrete and historically ascertainable gifts from God (as in 22), the reference is to gifts of a fundamental and general nature. Rom 11:29 speaks of the irrevocable gifts associated with Israel's election (i.e., the covenantal provisions spoken of in 9:4), and Rom 5-6 speaks correspondingly of the comparable new concrete dispensations; to be sure, the antithesis between trespass and gift of grace in 5:15 is not that between deed and consequence, since this gift of grace has of course been realized in Jesus' own counter-deed of obedience (v. 19). A surprising juxtaposition emerges between 5:15 (antithesis: death), 6:23 (eternal life/death), and 2 Cor 1:11: Everywhere in the charisma the God is at work who raises the dead and gives life. It has been suggested that xa/risma in 6:23 refers to the *donativum*, the special wage paid on the ascension of a new ruler. More likely, however, "wages" and the antithesis charisma suggest the opposition presented in 4:4.
- **4.** Hence for Paul the same holds true for xa/risma as for pneu=ma and pneumatika/: In addition to that which applies to everyone and is given to them at baptism or at the proclamation of the gospel itself (thus is Rom 1:11 to be understood; cf. also 15:27), there are also individual spiritual gifts and individual charismata. Just how structurally similar these two conceptions are can be seen not only in the fact that in both cases charisma is associated with calling (1 Cor 7:7,17,20; Rom 11:29), but also in the fact that according to 1 Cor 1:7 the individual charismata are provisional gifts anticipating the revelation of Jesus Christ in the same way that the Spirit common to all Christians is according to Rom 8:19-27.

Whereas the Spirit of baptism (the a)parxh/ in Rom 8:23; the a)rrabw/n in 2 Cor 1:22) is only indirectly visible in fruits at present, to be fully visible esp. at the resurrection (2 Cor 5:5-10), the best definition of individual charisma is that it is a "manifestation of the Spirit" even now (1 Cor 12:7). Thus it certainly does not include just any activity, but rather activity that astonishes and directs attention vertically. It thus probably includes, e.g., being unmarried as opposed to being married (1 Cor 7:7) and perhaps extraordinary demonstrations of God's power (2 Cor 1:11; note that the proemium in both Rom 1 and **II Corinthians** speaks of xa/risma).

One should not hastily disqualify as "charisma of office" the xa/risma which Timothy is granted through prophecy and the laying on of hands (by the elders/"Paul") and which he is called on to rekindle within himself (1 Tim [1:18] 4:14; 2 Tim 1:6), since it is probably no different from what was already common among the so-called congregation-apostles and also in the case of Paul (cf. Acts 13:1-3) and which through prophecy/speech of the Pneuma exhibits no lack of spirituality. The fact that the Pastorals do not speak in a general fashion about the charismata of the baptized does not allow us, given the nature of the genre (among other things, personal addressees), to draw any reliable conclusions.
